



### *Where to go?*

You can visit the legendary Arthurian town of Huelgoat with its lake, famous rocks, woodland walks and cycle routes.

Both Carhaix and Huelgoat have weekly markets and excellent shops, supermarkets, restaurants and bars.

The Nantes to Brest canal is perfect for walking, cycling, boating and fishing.

The regional National Parc d'Armorique: Forests and open moorland of outstanding natural beauty, littered with ancient standing stones and burial chambers.

Lac du Drennec offers yachting, canoeing and wind surfing, with safe sandy beaches for children.

Brittany beaches vary from dramatic rugged cliffs to rocky beaches on the north coast. The long sandy beaches of the Crozon Peninsula are safe for children and are only 45 minutes away.

Medieval towns, standing stones, churches and old farmhouses – the area is steeped in history and legends, with many examples of beautiful architecture.

You can discover the old Breton traditional dances and costumes at the numerous festivals throughout the summer months.

The Old Farmhouse and The White Gite, two lovely quiet Breton farmhouses, converted into comfortable holiday cottages. Set on 17 ha (42 acres) of organic pasture and woodlands, in picturesque countryside with fantastic views, bordered by a fishing river. Tracks to explore the surrounding area starting at the front door. Located near Huelgoat in Central Brittany: an ideal starting point to explore the whole of Brittany.

## Old Farmhouse

Originally built in 1846, this old natural stone farmhouse is full of character. Well equipped large kitchen, lounge, two bathrooms, three bedrooms (two double, one twin). Sleeps six. Central heating and woodfire make this an ideal property for winter breaks. Renting weeks start and end on Fridays.



## The White Gite

Charming and spacious house with enclosed garden full of flowers. Downstairs, an open plan kitchen, lounge and bathroom. Upstairs three bedrooms (one double and two twin). Sleeps six. Renting weeks start and end on Saturdays.



## *The area*

Less than an hour south of Roscoff, between the towns of Huelgoat and Carhaix, the farm is situated at the end of its own road and faces south looking out over beautiful surrounding countryside. Within the National Parc d'Amorique, there is nearby moorland, forests, rivers and lakes. The beaches of the Brittany coastlines to the north, west and south are all within an hour's drive.

## *Wildlife*

The farm itself is a haven for wildlife, with many rarer species of birds, including Kingfishers, Tree Creepers, Hen Harriers, Barn Owls and Crested Tits. Foxes, deer and squirrels are regular visitors and there have been a few sightings of otters playing in the river.

## *Children*

Many families coming from cities find that it doesn't take long for the children to choose a bike or head for the fields to play in this safe environment. There is something to do for all ages: Splashing in the shallow rocky river, having a look at the animals, playing football, jumping on the trampoline, or sitting in the sandpit, leaving parents free to relax and maybe even read a book or two.
